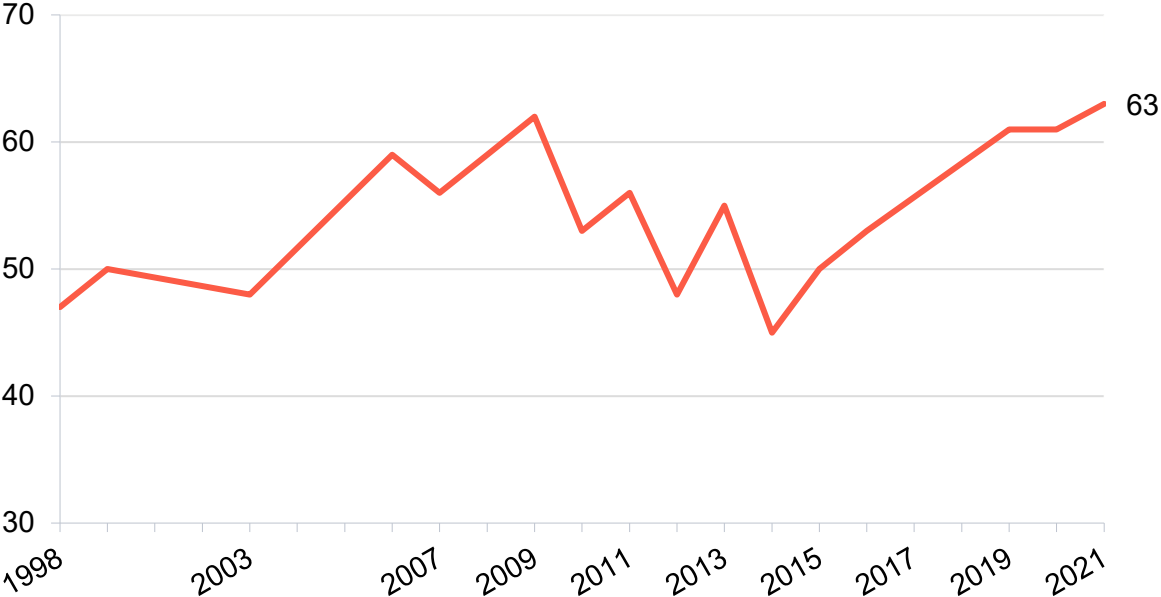

# Perceived seriousness of climate change continues to increase

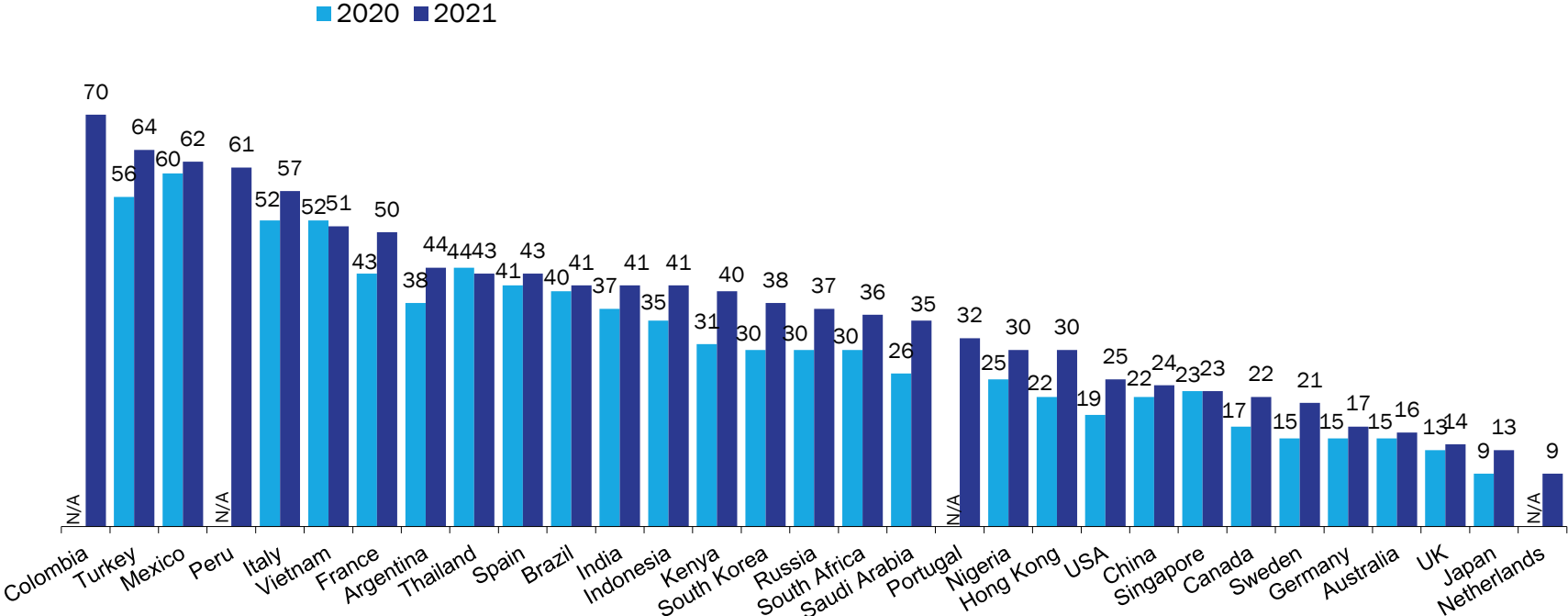
Seriousness of Climate Change "Very Serious," Average of 17 Markets,\* 1998–2021

Extent Personally Affected by Climate Change, "Greatly Affected," by Market, 2020–2021

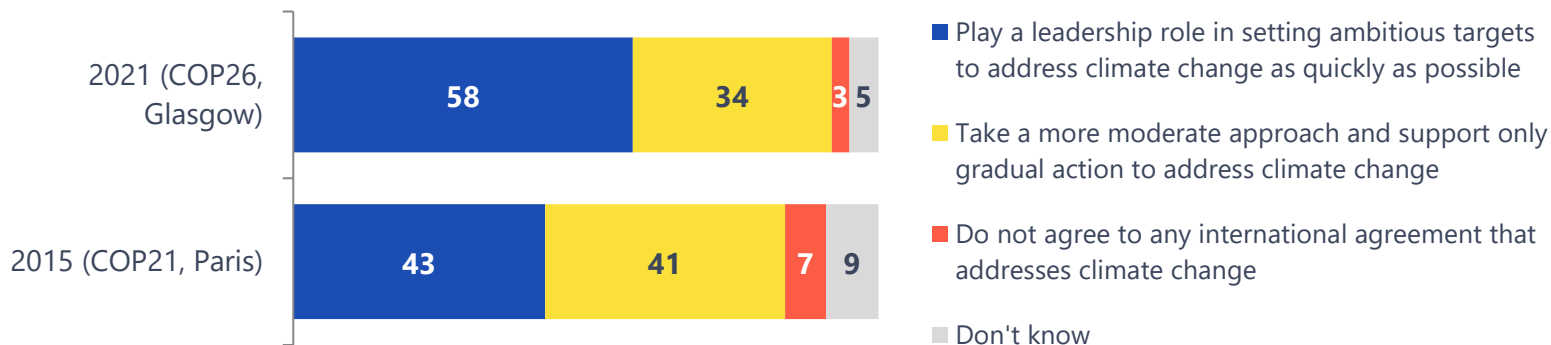


T2. How much are you personally affected by each of the following? – Climate change or global warming

Average of 18 Countries,\* 2015–2021

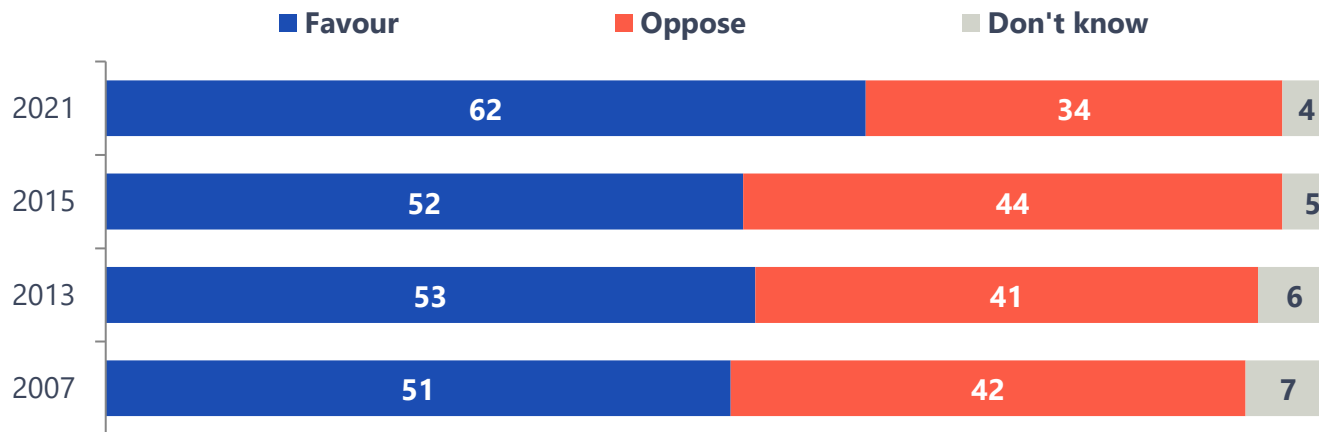
